The Organizations

- CoARC: Committee on Accreditation for RC
 - Accredit associate, baccalaureate and graduate RC programs and sleep programs
- NBRC: Credentialing agency
 - Write and administer credentialing exams
- AARC: professional organization
 - Promotes and lobbies for the profession
- State Licensing Board: grant license to practice in a given state



The NBRC

- Was formed in November 1960 to credential respiratory therapists
- Has supported the profession for over 55 years through development of national credentials
- Acts to ensure the continued recognition and value of NBRC credentials

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Primary Functions of the NBRC

- Determine the job respiratory therapists perform
- Develop examinations that relate to job performance
- Administer and score examinations
- Award credentials to persons who pass
- Ensure NBRC credentials continue to have value



NBRC Credentials are Standards of Excellence

- Certified Respiratory Therapist (CRT)
- Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT)
- Neonatal/Pediatric Respiratory Care Specialist (CRT-NPS or RRT-NPS)
- Sleep Disorders Specialist (CRT-SDS or RRT-SDS)
- Certified Pulmonary Function Technologist (CPFT)
- Registered Pulmonary Function Technologist (RPFT)
- Adult Critical Care Specialist (RRT-ACCS)



Five Steps to Construct Valid, Legally Defensible Examinations

- 1. Viability Study
 - Content experts: Unique job position; potential candidate pool?
- 2. Personnel Survey
 - Survey practicing professionals: Unique job position; potential candidate pool?
- 3. Job Analysis Study
 - Determines type, importance and time spent on tasks
- 4. Development of Test Specifications
 - Based on most significant tasks performed at a national level
- 5. Validation Study
 - Performance on test compared to immediate supervisor ratings



Examination questions are....

- Submitted by educators, practitioners, and physicians from around the country
- Evaluated and edited by testing experts
- Reviewed and further edited by NBRC examination committees
- Pretested before being used as scored questions on a credentialing examination



Passing scores are

- Established by NBRC examination committees and consultants using accepted, standardized procedures for establishing the minimum passing score (Cut Score)
 - Cut Score determination process
- Uniformly applied to all examinations to ensure all successful candidates have demonstrated the same level of competence regardless of the test form they took



NBRC Credentials are recognized by

- State licensure agencies
 - Currently, all states regulating respiratory care practice recognize the NBRC Examination as the requisite examination for demonstrating competence at beginning practice and allow CRTs and RRTs to receive licenses by reciprocity or endorsement without re-examination.
 - At RRT: California, Ohio
 - At CRT: all others

NBRC Credentialing Examinations

Process

- Daily testing via computer Monday-Saturday
 - Two sessions per day 9:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.
- Offered at over 195 Assessment Centers throughout the country

Results

- Candidates receive instant results upon leaving test center with photo printed on the score sheet
- Reapplication instructions provided, if needed



Continuing Competency Program (CCP)

- Credentials earned after July 1, 2002:
 - Are valid for five years
 - Require participation in the NBRC Continuing Competency Program to remain valid
- Credentials earned prior to July 1, 2002:
 - Are valid indefinitely and not subject to the CCP
 - But individuals can voluntarily participate in the program



CCP Requirements: 3 Options

- CE Credit: 30 hours/5 years
 - AARC CRCE approved courses
 - Respiratory care specific courses approved for state license renewal/continuing education
- Pass examination for highest credential held
- Pass examination not previously completed



CCP Communication from NBRC

- General information is provided through the annual renewal process
- Individualized Notices:
 - Anniversary e-mail sent every year in the month the credential was earned
 - One year prior to expiration official notice
 - Six months prior to expiration
 - 90-days prior to expiration
 - 30-days prior to expiration
 - Immediately upon expiration



CCP Continuing Education Submission

- Online process at www.nbrc.org
- Random audit
- Simple and easy
- Can renew via CE up until the day before credential expires



Judicial and Ethics Policies

- NBRC protects the public and the profession through the Judicial & Ethics Committee
- The Judicial & Ethics Committee takes action against people who:
 - Violate testing rules
 - Misuse credential trademarks
 - Commit practice-related offenses or serious crimes
 - Have their state license revoked or suspended



J & E General Process

- Complaint brought to NBRC attention
- Determine whether case warrants a committee hearing at the next J&E meeting
- Notify individual of hearing indent; allow defense
- Conduct the hearing; determine sanction
- Notify individual of hearing outcome; allow appeal
- Full Board of Trustees (w/o J&E Committee)
 hear appeal; final decision



Sanctions Available

- For exam candidates (NBRC cases):
 - Admonishment
 - Formal Censure
 - Removal from the examination process for a specified period
 - Removal from the examination process for a indefinite period



Sanctions Available

- For credentialed individuals (State cases):
 - Admonishment
 - Formal Censure
 - Removal from the Annual Directory for a specified or indefinite period (SOIP)
 - Disqualification from Recredentialing or Self-assessment programs
 - Removal from the examination process for a SOIP
 - Deletion from 'Active' credentialing status for a SOIP
 - Suspension of a credential for a SOIP
 - Suspension from the examination system for a SOIP
 - Mandatory reexamination to document continued competence




What's New at the NBRC?


- Following extensive, ongoing internal research regarding testing and measurement, the NBRC Board of Trustees voted (Dec. 2011) to evaluate implementing significant changes to the respiratory therapy credentialing system beginning in 2015.
- Changes include:
 - A single multiple choice examination with separate passing points for the CRT credential and eligibility for the Clinical Simulation Examination
 - A Clinical Simulation Examination which includes a larger number of shorter simulation problems.



Convergence of Tasks

Over the last 4 job analysis studies, the subset of 'RRT-only' content shown in red has shrunk

New Therapist Multiple-Choice (TMC) Examination

- Examination length:
 - Remains at 140 scored items and 20 pretest items (don't contribute to scores)
- Two cut scores. Candidates with test scores at or above the:
 - LOWER cut score, are granted the CRT credential
 - HIGHER cut score, are also be eligible to take the Clinical Simulation Examination

Changes to the Clinical Simulation Exam (CSE)

Previous CSE

- 10 long scored problems (plus 1 non-scored pre-test item)
- Instant scoring limits ability to update existing problems or to add new ones
- Information Gathering and Decision Making are 2 separate scores

New/Current CSE:

- 20 problems, half the length of the current problems (plus 2 pretest items)
- Easier to make changes or add new problems
- Must have obtained the higher cut score on the Therapist Multiple-Choice Examination to be eligible for the CSE
- Information Gathering and Decision Making are 1 combined score



How the TMC Is Performing


TMC First-Time Candidate Pass Rate

CSE First-Time Candidate Pass Rate






PFT Examination Changes

Adult Critical Care Specialty Examination

Admission Requirements | Free Practice Examination | FAQs

In 2012, the NBRC launched a new specialty examination for respiratory therapists working in adult critical care settings. We sought input from a variety of organizations representing professionals involved in the arena of adult critical care so we could create a valuable credential that your employer, colleagues and patients will recognize and respect.

This specialty examination program was built on a collaborative effort with other organizations with a vested interest in protecting the public and improving care for adult patients receiving treatment in critical care settings. Because of this effort, this program was wide support from organizations such as:

- · The American Association for Respiratory Care
- · The American College of Chest Physicians
- · The American Society of Anesthesiologists
- · The American Thoracic Society

The Adult Critical Care Specialty Examination program is designed specifically for a respiratory therapist with the RRT credential and experience in the field of adult critical care.

Eligible certificants have already demonstrated advanced knowledge in the field of respiratory care; therefore this examination will focus on competencies unique to therapists practicing in an adult critical care setting and not basic competenies of general respiratory

Why should you earn the RRT-ACCS credential? The answer is simple—this specialty examination is unique to your daily tasks as an adult critical care specialist. It goes above and beyond general respiratory care activities so you can demonstrate your enhanced skill level in a fast-growing specialty within the field.

If you are planning to take any of the credentialing examinations offered by the National Board for Respiratory Care, Inc. (NBRC), the Self-Assessment Examination provides an excellent opportunity for you to find out in advance how well you will do. The SAEs are available in webbased format and more information can be found by clicking the Self-Assessment Examination Quick Link

Admission Requirements

1. Be an RRT with at least one year of full-time clinical experience in a critical care setting (e.g. intensive care unit, emergency room, post-anesthesia recovery unit, long-term acute

*Full time experience is defined as a minimum of 21 hours per week per calendar year in a critical care setting under medical supervision following Certification (MD, DO or PhD) acceptable to the Board. Clinical experience must be completed before the candidate applies for this examination.



Other Activities

- New test specifications for Sleep Disorders Examination to be implemented in 2016
- Recertification Commission convened to review the Continuing Competency Program
 - CCP initiated in 2002
 - National Commission for Certifying Agencies standards updated in 2014
 - First meeting September 17
 - Represented by all stakeholders



Other Activities

- AARC and NBRC collaboration and CCP
 - Process to allow AARC CRCE data to transmit directly into the NBRC's online recertification database
 - Functionality launched on September 17, 2015



Examination Vouchers Now Available

- Allows third parties to pay the full examination fee and receive a voucher code to be dispersed to examination candidates.
- Candidates input the voucher code when applying for the examination to receive the examination fee credit.
- Vouchers are only valid for:
 - One year from the date of purchase, and
 - The specific examination purchased
- Details on how to purchase vouchers will be sent to all program directors via email in the coming weeks.
