Advance Practice Respiratory Therapist	The role of advance practice respiratory therapist (APRT) has been explored for several years a now and has become a strategic goal of the AARC. Asthma Updates: From Mild to Severe Asthma Management	Growing research and clinical evidence is providing insights in asthma leading to a shift in the approach from empirical treatment escalation towards precise, and in some instances biomarker-driven strategies. This talk is aimed at enabling healthcare providers to better understand current strategies to apply precision medicine to the care of asthma. Asthma patients can experience frequent debilitating symptoms and limitations, often leading to exacerbations. This talk will highlight important changes in the management strategies of both mild and severe asthmatics in both primary care and subspecialty settings.	Njira L Lugogo, M.D. University of Michigan
Bronchoscopic Lung Volume Reduction for COPD	This session will introduce a recently approved treatment form for patients with severe COPD known as Bronchoscopic Lung Volume Reduction (BLVR). It will cover recent literature supporting its use, indications, complications and our hospital experience.	A. Rolando Peralta, M.D. Henry Ford Hospital
CPAP and Organ at Risk Sparing in Radiation Therapy	Respiratory motion is frequently a limiting factor that complicates planning and delivery of radiation to tumors in the lung and abdomen. We will discuss strategies that radiation oncology practices have employed thus far to mitigate this effect. We propose a novel approach to minimizing tissue motion with continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP), a device widely used to aid patients with obstructive sleep apnea. However, imaging with conventional linear accelerators is limited to ionizing radiation, limiting frequent image acquisition. Recently, the Henry Ford Cancer Institute introduced the world's first MRI-guided linear accelerator into clinical practice. The MR-linac uses non-ionizing imaging to localize and track tumors during radiation therapy. We leveraged the real-time tracking with MRI to more fully characterize the potential of CPAP in reduction of radiation exposure to organs at risk.	Evan Liang, M.D. Henry Ford Hospital
